

Pet First Aid App

Pets are an important part of many families, and a new Red Cross Pet First Aid App can help dog and cat owners learn how to provide care until veterinary assistance is available.

- Forty seven percent of households count a dog among their family members and forty six percent have a cat. [Source: American Pet Products Association Pet Owners Survey]
- Users can easily toggle between "Dog" and "Cat" content.
- The cost of less than \$1 per download is a small price to have expert pet safety information in the palm of your hand.

The Red Cross Pet First Aid App has resources developed by experts on how to maintain a pet's health and what to do during emergencies.

- Pet owners learn about signs of a healthy dog or cat so they can recognize health problems early. Catching potential illness or injury early can make a huge difference in treatment success.
- The app gives users instant access to information including step-by-step instructions, videos and images for more than 25 common first aid and emergency situations for dogs and cats.
- App users will learn how to treat wounds, control bleeding and care for breathing and cardiac emergencies. Information about administering medication, behavioral and nutritional information is also included.
- Additional topics include burns, car accidents, falls and what to do for cold- and heat-related emergencies.

The app also has a click-to-call feature to allow pet owners to quickly contact their veterinarian, and also contains an "animal hospital locator" to find emergency pet care facilities or alternate veterinarians.

- Owners can create a pet profile including tag identification number, photos and list of medications with instructions.
- The list of early warning signs helps users learn when to call their veterinarian.
- Users also can also locate pet-friendly hotels for when they travel.
- The app lets pet owners test their knowledge with interactive quizzes and earn badges that they can attach their favorite pet photo to and share on their social networks.

We understand the important emotional role that pets play in the lives of families and the Red Cross has several resources so owners can include pets in their emergency action plans.

- History shows that people will risk their lives for their family pets during disasters by not evacuating or by trying to rescue them. Including your pets in emergency planning before a disaster keeps the whole family safe.
- If you need to evacuate, take your pets. If it's not safe for you to stay, it's not safe for your pet.
- Learn how to assemble a pet first aid kit and how to prepare an emergency kit for your pets that includes leashes, food, water, toys, medical records and an animal carrier.
- In addition to downloading the app, people can take a Red Cross Pet First Aid course for the health and safety of your pet and for your piece of mind.

The Red Cross has made great strides in making emergency information available to people whenever and wherever they need it. This allows people to make critical, lifesaving decisions.
